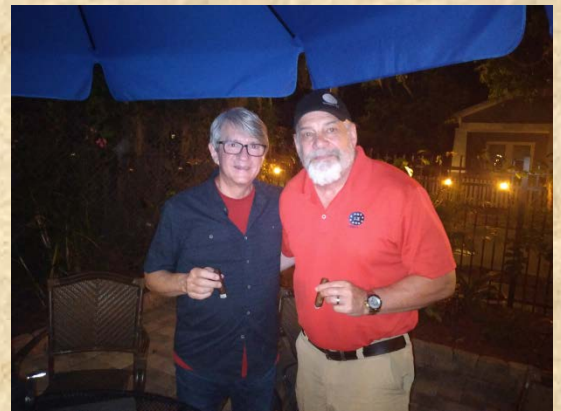

Fighting the ATF's attack on so called "Ghost Guns"



If the AFT (as Der Fuhrer Biden calls it) has their way, chunks of metal or plastic that are "clearly identifiable as an unfinished component part of a weapon" would meet their new definition of "frame or receiver." So, these partially complete, disassembled, or inoperable frames or receivers would be required to be serialized by manufacturers and transferred on a 4473, completed with NICS background check. This would eliminate a law-abiding citizen's current right to make a firearm for his/her own use and not have the government involved. Remember, if a firearm is on someone's list, it is a simple matter to track down the owner and confiscate the firearm, which - make no mistake - is the left's ultimate goal to create a disarmed society.



To make matters worse, the ATF is proposing to require multiple parts of a firearm be serialized and subject to transfer on a 4473, with NICS check. In the case of their new “Split or modular frame or receiver” definition, ATF says, “Frames or receivers of different weapons that are combined to create a similar weapon each retain their respective classifications as frames or receivers provided they retain their original design and configuration.” Effectively, they are creating multiple weapons from a single weapon, which, I believe violates the Gun Control Act of 1968.

The GCA defines a “firearm” as (A) any weapon (including a starter gun) which will or is designed to or may readily be converted to expel a projectile by the action of an explosive; (B) the **frame or receiver** of any such weapon; (C) any firearm muffler or firearm silencer; or (D) any destructive device. Such term does not include an antique firearm.

As written, the definition clearly states frame **or** receiver, not both. If both were to be considered firearms, then the definition would have said “**and.**” The ATF is overstepping its bounds and is creating new law, which only Congress may do.

We must fight this proposed rule by making reasoned comments against its implementation.
